Techno-political interfaces. Collective agents and multiple transitions

This talk proposes a critical analysis of the emancipatory potential of (bio)technology through interfaces in the context of artistic practices. As a continuation of the open, though insufficient, cracks caused by systematic thought and structural analysis, this proposal seeks to address the (bio)techno-political interfaces, populated by situated epistemologies and affirmative politics, as triggers that call for responsibilities as collective agents capable of making transitions between multiple levels of political, material and conceptual organization, taking artistic research and its performativity as a framework and condition of possibility. Understanding research as a power to perform (some aspects/ or phenomena) of what we call in general terms "reality".
